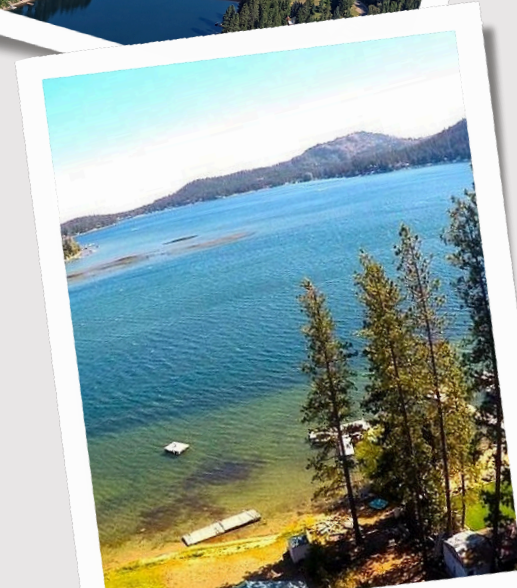
- Right on the Pend Oreille River
